Please be advised that the San Bernardino County, Department of Public Health, Division of Environmental Health Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) received and accepted a Post-closure Land Use Plan (PCLUP) for Cajon Solid Waste Disposal Site (36-AA-0053).

An exemption has been issued pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 27, Section 21190(g) for certain activities associated with the Cajon Solid Waste Disposal Site.

This determination follows a thorough review of submitted PCLUP/project information and applicable

regulatory requirements governing solid waste facilities.

Key Points:

- The approved exemption applies only to the specific activities and conditions identified in the LEA determination.
- The exemption does not relieve the operator from compliance with other federal, state, or local laws, regulations, permits, or approvals.
- The facility is a County-owned, County-regulated closed solid waste landfill.
- The exemption supports implementation of project-related activities while maintaining protection of public health, safety, and the environment.
- On March 19, 2026, the LEA completed its review and issued the exemption determination, confirming that it is consistent with State Minimum Standards.
